

Gynaecology Acute Treatment Unit clinic (GATU Clinic) Criteria and Information

Early Pregnancy problems

- Up to 13+6 weeks with
Abdominal / Pelvic pain or vaginal bleeding in early
pregnancy

Gynaecology problems

- Sudden unexpected severe abdominal/ pelvic pain of suspected gynaecological origin
- Sudden unexpected heavy vaginal bleeding
- Vulval abscess including Bartholins
- Suspected Post-operative complications following gynaecological surgery within 30 days of procedure
- Ascites related to underlying gynaecological cancer
- Urinary retention due to gynaecological prolapse
- Ovarian hyper-stimulation
- Postnatal problems who are more that 28 days post delivery
