

COVID-19 vaccine sites in and around Beeston

Information correct as of 02/08/2021.

Please note:

- All people aged 18 and over are eligible for the vaccine
- Face coverings must be worn at all vaccination centres

For people living in and around **Beeston** we recommend the following vaccination sites:

- 1 Elland Road Park and Ride** Beeston, Leeds LS11 0EB
- 2 Superdrug, Merrion Centre** Leeds, LS2 8NG
- 3 Village Hotel, South Leeds** Capitol Blvd, Tingley LS27 OTS

Appointments are essential at **all** of these sites, and can be booked by visiting: nhs.uk/covid-vaccination or calling: **119**.

Leeds Vaccine Bus

The vaccine bus is in a different location each week, and offers walk-in appointments to anyone aged 40 and above. People living in and around Beeston may find it convenient to use the bus when it is:

- At **Maud Avenue on Tuesday 10 August to Friday 13 August**. It is open **10:00am to 16:00pm**.
- Alternatively, when it is at **Meynell Approach, adjacent to St Matthew's Church in Holbeck**, from **Tuesday 07 September to Friday 10 September**. It is open **10:00am to 16:00pm**.

Temporary vaccine sites

About the Covid-19 vaccine

- All people aged 18 and over are now eligible for the vaccination.
- If you are aged over 50, living with a long term condition or have a suppressed immune system, you are at increased risk from Covid. Vaccines can help prevent you becoming seriously ill.
- The vaccines are safe and have been through rigorous checks, as well as extensive trials.
- Each vaccine requires two doses, 8 weeks apart (or sooner for people with health conditions that make them more vulnerable). The 1st dose gives you good protection from 3 or 4 weeks after having it. Having the second dose gives you stronger and longer-lasting protection.
- Having a vaccination is the best way to protect yourself, your family and your community from serious illness.
