

COVID-19 vaccine sites in and around LS5 & LS6

Information correct as of 08/02/2021.

Please note:

- All people aged 18 and above are eligible for the vaccine.
- Face coverings must be worn at all vaccine sites.

For people living in and around **LS5** and **LS6** we recommend the following vaccination sites:

1 Village Hotel, Leeds North 186 Otley Road, Headingley LS16 5PR

Temporary vaccine sites

About the COVID-19 vaccine:

- All people aged 18 and over are now eligible for the vaccination.
- If you are aged over 50, living with a long term condition or have a suppressed immune system, you are at increased risk from Covid. Vaccines can help prevent you becoming seriously ill.
- The vaccines are safe and have been through rigorous checks, as well as extensive trials.
- Each vaccine requires two doses, 8 weeks apart (or sooner for people with health conditions that make them more vulnerable). The 1st dose gives you good protection from 3 or 4 weeks after having it. Having the second dose gives you stronger and longer-lasting protection.
- Having a vaccination is the best way to protect yourself, your family and your community from serious illness.
